I am amazed at the things APA has accomplished, and excited about the things which are on the horizon for us. We began as an organization whose name said it all.... We were the Texas Registered Accessibility Specialists Association. One of the first goals of our group was to come together and present a unified voice in communicating with the State of Texas. Another was to provide the continuing education necessary for the State's licensing program. There were probably other goals along those lines but over time, more and more of us recognized that our group had the potential to become a national organization, and that we could accomplish even greater things than were originally envisioned.

This year at our conference we had attendees from Oklahoma, Missouri, Tennessee, the state of Washington, Colorado, Maryland, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, New Mexico, Alabama, Alaska, California, Oregon, Wisconsin, Georgia, and of course Texas.

A lot has been done and moving forward into the next year we will continue to grow as a national organization. In 2019, in addition to providing evermore excellent training opportunities at our annual conference and at our regional trainings, we provided a day-long training in August in Miami, Florida, which was very successful with over 90 people in attendance. APA Member Honored by JBMS Gift

What better way to pay tribute to a career of professional service than to pave the way for junior members who might hope to follow suit.

That is exactly why Bob Davies served as a member of the Jim Boyce Memorial Scholarship (JBMS) and why his wife, Mary Rae, decided a gift to JBMS was a fitting way to salute and honor him for the work he did to expand and enhance the accessibility field. The Accessibility Professionals Association lost a great friend and member upon his passing on December 19, 2019, at the age of 88. Bob (Robert) Davies hailed from Irving, Texas.

As one of the earliest Registered Accessibility Specialists, Bob spent a long career dedicated to improving the quality of life for many disabled citizens by using his skills honed in the field and through his very active membership in APA.

The scholarship has enabled numerous students to begin their career in the accessibility field since it began in 2003. Students who wish to apply must be currently pursuing a degree in architecture, landscape architecture, civil engineering, construction management, interior design, or other degree program closely related to accessibility/universal design at an accredited United States institution of higher learning. Students must have a 2.5 or higher GPA and demonstrate a strong interest in accessibility in both design portfolio and future career interests.

Each year applications are accepted through March and the scholarship is awarded in May via the attended institution's financial aid office.

Today, APA members are encouraged to consider the <u>Jim Boyce Memorial Scholarship</u> as a meaningful way to channel their charitable donations.
