#### **Board of Directors**

On behalf of APA members, the Board guides the organization and achieves desired results within approved budgets. This year the Board:

- Developed the ADA-TAS Exam option and test questions for those who wish to satisfy criteria for an alternate path to achieving the APA-ADA Specialist Designation. Launched the ADA-TAS Training and Testing Exam at the 2017 Annual Conference.
- Successfully launched the APA-ADA Specialist Designation with 61 individuals receiving the designation in 2016
- Refined the APA-ADA Specialist Designation program for the 2017 Annual Conference
- Updated the Mission and APA Strategic Plan (March) in order to provide focused direction to the organization
- Continued "re-branding" the organization via updated marketing materials, partnership development and the APA website to promote our members and organization nationally
- Continued operational and budget oversight
- Provided board liaisons to each APA committee and task force
- Continued ongoing support and development of the Jim Boyce Scholarship Fund
- Continued discussion regarding Advance Certification initiative with the introduction of a Fair Housing Track at the 2017 Annual Conference
- Utilized legal reviews and insurance coverage as needed to protect the organization
- Renewed organizational management services with KWPM per contract

### Education & Events Committee (Co-Chairs: Kim Goss, Jim Terry)

APA continued to maintain and improve its education services for AIA, ICC, ADA Coordinators, Texas RAS's and other Design Professionals by focusing on CE Training at the 2016 Annual Conference, three Regional Trainings, AIA Training and the 2017 Annual Conference. This year the Committee Members:

- Added CE Credit for ADA Coordinators (ACTCP Foundation) to the 2017 Annual Conference
- Provided over 3120 hours of TDLR-, AIA- and ICC-approved CE Units of training
- Conducted three Regional Training Meetings to reach members and guests closer to their home-base
- Conducted 23 AIA-approved classes delivered by our members to reach out to individuals outside our membership.

- Utilized break-out sessions at the 2016 Annual Conference with an emphasis on providing a range of courses for the spectrum of Accessibility Specialist
- Surveyed members following each training, in an effort to continually improve programs
- Worked with other APA Committees to improve, coordinate, and promote programs
- Reached out to National ADA providers, such as the ADA Symposium, to expand membership training and marketing opportunities
- Continued to promote APA training through expanded contact lists (HUD, ACTCP)
- Planned the 2017 APA Annual Conference to include a diverse group of subjects, tracks and experts

### Legislative & Legal Committee (Co-Chairs: Peter Grojean, Carroll Pruitt )

Monitoring legal issues affecting APA, keeping tabs on national legislation as well as interfacing with TDLR and the Texas Legislature remain some of APA's most important functions. This year the Committee:

- Provided APA input to TDLR regarding the proposed revision to Chapter 68 and RAS Procedures
- Represented our members and testified at the Architectural Advisory Committee Meeting in Austin
- Continued to support our membership as it relates to TDLR enforcement and application of administrative penalties to assure equitable enforcement amongst RASs

#### **Communications: (Chair: Mark Morley)**

The committee is responsible for the quarterly APA newsletter and, when needed, reviews the effectiveness of all APA communication tools. Acting as the "gatekeeper", we support other committees, as needed, with communications. This year we:
